

Q4] Define Bio diversity explain level value of bio diversity and discuss western ghats as a biodiversity region.

Answer] Bio Diversity

Earth is known to be the only living planet due to the life it support "biodiversity or biological diversity is refered to the vast range of life forms from simple microscopic unicellular to the evolved complex biodiversity is broadly described to three levels

1] Genetic diversity

This is the diversity represented to the organism in the basic hereditary information units "genes" within a species which are passed down to generation genetic diversity result in variation this diversity gives rise to different varieties of rice and other crops a large number of varieties to the species can be seen or sensed by colour taste flavour but most are invisible such as disease resistance behavioural patterns etc genetic diversity is important in breeding crops and livestock

2] species diversity

species is generally isolated unit of organism which is used to classify millions of different plant and animals forms on earth as each species is distant from other species

in form and character such as cow and goat only similar species can produce fertile offspring. Species diversity is measured in terms of species richness. It is the most common level to describe bio-diversity of any given area. Based on this level of diversity some countries like India are included in mega-diversity countries.

5] Ecosystem diversity

Ecosystem concept includes living organisms (plants, animals, micro organisms) and non-living things (air, soil, water, minerals etc) in a given area, with exchange of material and interaction between them. Ecosystem diversity is the force or site where an organism or a population of organism naturally occur.

* Value of bio diversity

Due to increasing negative human impact on environment knowingly or unknowingly the bio-diversity today is being degraded at an alarming rate unless value of bio-diversity is known by all there will not be serious efforts for its conservation.

The value of biodiversity can be described of the following broad categories

1] Consumptive value:

every species of plant animal

has a potential value to humans as the habitats and ecosystems is a valuable resources that provides for human needs today and is essential that provides for human needs today and is essential for human survival in the future man totally depends on other species of plants and animals for food, medicine, fiber, and other requirements which ultimately determines its wellbeing and the quality of life.

2] productive:

Bio-diversity provides the necessary raw material for domestic and industrial use which support human civilization. It is estimated that around 80% population from the developing countries like India depend on traditional medicine for primary health care. Most of which is derived from plant resources over 20000 plants are used for this purpose in this countries even around 25% of the drugs included 21 indispensable mainstream drugs used in development countries are made from plant material.

3] Social value

In the traditional oriental culture practices and rituals lot of importance is attributed to the ethical value of biodiversity. It is believed that each species is a unique creation of nature and every has been depicted in a

st every religion this point of view has strong & great influence in the modern society as were therefore the view has been adopted by the united nations in the world charter for nature in 1982

5] Aesthetic value-

Apparently the most commonly attribute value to biodiversity is the aesthetic value ever since the early man the beauty of nature has attracted his attention and has created a special place in life tourism is considered to be one of the largest and fastest growing industries in the world where nature tourism plays significant role it also provides various job opportunities and livelihood to the locals in a number of ways.

6] option value-

It is believed that biodiversity of plant and animals we see around us today though not fully understood gives us immense options to meet our varied domestic and industrial demands however in the light of rapidly changing environmental scenario it is likely that many of the vital species of plants & animals which sustain humanity today as life support system will be reduce in the near future in quality as well as quantity

The western Ghats or locally known as Sahyadri in its northern portion mountain range run to a full length of 1600 km more or less parallel to west coast starting from the mouth of the river Tapi in district of Maharashtra and ending at Kongal in Karnataka. The entire region covers an area of about 160000 sq. km and supports a serveral of over 45 million. It is the origin of serveral big and small east flowing rivers such as Krishna, Bhima, Tungabhadra, Karveer, Kalishaxawati, etc. These rivers provides 200 billion cubic meters of water i.e. 20% of the utilisable water available in India because of its strategic location.

The forest abound in the medicinal plants orchids grasses trees & mango the species altogether nearly 4500 species of flowering plants the western Ghats is home as the tiger elephant leopard bear and some of the 400 bird species recorded in the region.

pollution is defined as undesirable changes in the physical chemical or biological characteristics of natural water air or soil which adversely affect the life or can create a health hazards to living organisms or damage to non-living things

Now we will study types of pollution as follows

1] Noise pollution

It can be defined as any sound i.e. undesirable because it interferes with speech and hearing is intense enough to damage the hearing ability

The noise pollution depends upon factors like frequency intensity time of exposure

• Sources of noise pollution

major sources of noise pollution are natural sources and man source natural sources include thunder heavy rain wind storm etc

man made source are generally classification into groups such as non-industrial

and industrial sources non-industrial sources includes noise from domestic motor vehicle horns railway market noise etc in industry source noise could be generated from machines which involve grinding drilling cutting welding blasting fabrication work etc.

Effect of Noise pollution:-

The effect on human beings is classified as auditory source noise and non-auditory effect auditory effect includes auditory fatigue and deafness non-auditory effect includes contraction of blood vessels skin pain high blood pressure affect the efficiency and behaviour of person it can cause damage to heart brain kidney liver and produce emotional disturbance

effect on non-living things such as building undergoes physical damage by cracks broken window door damaging surface material explosive sound on three behaviours and adverse effect on feeding and breeding habits

prevention and control measures:

control on noise can be achieved by following ways as follows

i] Reducing noise of source level by use of silencing device change in operation process

ii] Reducing noise of receiver level by use of earplugs noise helmets ear muffs & rotation of workers

iii] Use of barriers such as development of buffer zones construction walls enclosure around noisy machinery

iv] creating awareness about noise pollution among people through T.V Radio newspaper

B] Thermal pollution

Thermal pollution is associated with harmful effects of sudden increase in ambient temperature in a stream lake or oceans to discharge of heated water from industrial process this pollution is mainly related to aquatic environment

• Source

Heat and hot water many industrial process is basic cause of thermal pollution in thermal power plant coal fired plant required huge amount cooling water for heat removed condensate. out of this

industries are cooled with water from nearby lake river & after the cooling process hot water is discharge back into water system which increases the temperature of water

• effects of thermal pollution.

Cold water contains more oxygen than hot increase in temperature lower the dissolved oxygen level and this low dissolved oxygen level lead to anaerobic conditions it act as thermal shock and redistribution of organism in the local community local community it cause increase in decomposition rate of organic matter

fresh water found population declines with rise in temperature in a stream lake or ocean due to discharge of heated this thermal pollution

• Control measure of thermal pollution

The abatement of cooling water discharge can be effectively accomplished by various types of diffuse system in large bodies of water outlet water must be cool before discharge in water bodies cooling pond water is exposed to atmosphere to decrease the temperature after decrease in temperature water

after decrease in tempⁿ water is discharged into river or lake are accidental release from cargo's tankers ship accident washing of oil tanker's effluent from oil ect.

d) Marine pollution

marine pollution can be defined as the changes in the physical, chemical and biological properties of sea water due to discharge of waste material or heat into the sea resulting harm to marine life hazards to human health fishery and impairment of quality for use of sea water.

• Sources of marine pollution

i) Industries-

many industries situated in the coastal area directly or indirectly pollute the oceans by discharging different residues of toxic chemicals, colours, heavy metal residues, oil and grease etc.

ii) Domestic waste-

hardly largest population residing on the coastal areas in small towns and domestic pollution includes the dis

of community sewage garbage etc most of the coastal cities are not having their own sewage treatment plants

iii) oil spills-

The sources of oil in the oceans are accidental release from cargo tankers ship accidents washing of oil tankers effluent from oil refineries leakage from pipelines oil transportation etc

• effects of marine pollution

i) The domestic sewage has high organic content which leads to depletion of oxygen from the sea water the lesser oxygen is responsible for eutrophication in the ocean environment through sewage discharge

ii) the detergents present in the sewage and the residue of chemical fertilizers produce nutrient rich condition eutrophication which creates anaerobic environment here the diversity of flora and fauna get reduced

iii) the chemical pesticides like DDT BHC heavy metals like mercury get accumulated

in food chain & finally leads to bio magnification

• Control measures -

i] Proper treatment to the domestic sewage and industrial effluent before disposal into the sea is necessary

ii] Ban on disposal of refuse like plastic bags nets ropes thermocol etc

iii] precautionary measure for oil transportation should be taken

iv] Recycling and reuse of dispoased water eg from thermal power plants

v] Ban on transport and discharge of ballast water.

Thus, the manager has to choose a project that gives a rate of return more than the cost financing such a project. That is why he has to value a project in terms of cost and Benefit.

→ The various tools used at present in management accounting may be classified into the following groups :-

① Financial planning :- The main objective of any business organisation is maximization of profits. This objective is achieved by making proper or sound financial planning. Hence financial planning is considered as best tool for achieving business objectives.

② Financial statement analysis :- Profit & Loss account & Balance sheet are important financial statements. These statements are analysed for different period. This type of analysis helps the management to know the rate of growth of business concern. This analysis is done through comparative financial statements, common size statements & ratio analysis. It is the most important tool of the management accounting.

③ Cost Accounting :- Cost Accounting presents cost data in product wise, process wise, department wise, branch wise, & the like. These cost data are compared with pre-determined one.

④ Statistical techniques :- These are a lot of statistical techniques used in removing management problems. Methods of least square regression & quality control etc. are some examples of statistical techniques.

⑤ Historical cost Accounting :- It means that costs are recorded after being incurred. This is used for comparing with predetermined costs to evaluate performance.

⑥ Standard Costing :- Standard costing is predetermined cost. It provides a yard stick for measuring actual performance. It is used to find the reasons for the deviations if any.

Q2) Explain in detail steps in Budget preparation.

→ Many organizations prepare budgets that they use as a method of comparison when evaluating their actual results over the next year. The process of preparing a budget should be highly regimented and follow a set schedule, so that the complete budget is ready. Following are the steps of Budget preparation.

- ① Update budget assumptions: Review the assumptions about the company's business environment that were used as the basis for the last budget.
- ② Review bottlenecks: - Determine the capacity level of the primary bottlenecks that is constraining the company from generating further sales & define how this will impact any additional company revenue growth.
- ③ Available funding: - Determine the most likely amount of funding that will be available during the budget period, which may limit growth plans.


